Report on Midland Section ACS Strategic Planning Retreat Michelle Cummings, Past-Chair, and Tina Leaym, Councilor, Midland Section ACS

Sincere thanks to all who completed the recent Midland Section survey conducted by the National ACS! The results were taken very seriously by a representative group of volunteers who donated a September weekend to develop a Strategic Plan for the Midland local section.

Professional ACS facilitators, Larry Krannich and Carol Duane, guided the group to craft a bold and audacious mission statement: *Advancing chemical exploration, inquiry, and practice in the Great Lakes Bay Region and beyond.*

Next came the vision statement, and then three actionable goals were hammered out. These guiding principles were approved by the Midland Section's leadership at the October 5 Board meeting.

Vision statement: **Promote chemistry and improve public perception of science through innovation in research, education and career development for the benefit of our members and partners.**

- Goal 1: Double average member participation in section events [Impact, high; Resources, Medium]
- Goal 2: Annually provide relevant, innovative, technical programming that reaches a total number of participants equivalent to 30% of the total section membership. [Impact, High; Resources, Medium]
- Goal 3: Identify, create, and implement a differentiated strategy for public outreach that leverages existing resources. [Impact, High; Resources, Medium-High]

One might ask, "What is Strategic Planning?" In our context, it is defined as the disciplined, creative process for determining how to take the Midland Section from where it is today to where we want to go. The focused goals are designed so they can be accomplished over the next five years.

This promises to be an exciting journey for the Midland Section as we set out to accomplish our goals! Members are encouraged to get involved. Ask yourself, "Is there one area where you have interest around improving the effectiveness of our organization?"
